## Right now nick jonas song lyrics

Demi Lovato and the Jonas Brothers have been linked since the beginning of all their careers. They starred together in the Disney Channel films Camp Rock, which led them on tour and work together for many years to come. But of the three brothers, Lovato was closer to two: Joe and Nick. And although it was not released as a single, this song, which, like most of the album, was co-written by Lovato and the Jonas Brothers, has received attention in recent years. On The Late Show with Stephen Colbert, Lovato said she was a little burned at a tender age of 15 by Joe. She explains that while writing the song, Joe said of the romantic story, 'maybe it has a happy ending.' I was like, 'No, I think he gets caught, and everybody sees that he's a heartbreaker,' apparently reflecting his own feelings about Joe back in it. 'Catch Me' Catch Me is a song from Lovato's second studio album, Here We Go Again 2009. Although it was not released as a single, it managed to chart briefly, remaining at No. 89 for only a week. This is the only song on the album—and throughout his discography—for which Lovato received a single songwriting credit. She told the New York Times it was written by myself in my room. Although it is not confirmed that Catch Me is about Joe, Lovato wrote it on his own, which means it is very personal. And although he also arrived before they were a couple, Lovato said in his 2017 documentary Simply Complicated that he fell in love with him while filming Camp Rock in 2007. Have you been in love with him the whole time? he asked. Your answer? Oh, yes! 'Ruin the Friendship' RELATED: Demi Lovato and Nick Jonas aren't Friends Anymore, but she is silent about why they no longer speak for their fifth album, Confident. Lovato reunited with Nick (then a solo artist) on the Future Now Tour. With his next album, Tell Me You Love Me 2017, Lovato wrote the song Ruin the Friendship, about wanting to take a platonic relationship to the next level. Lovatos chose specific references that relate to Nick, such as his affinity for cigars. He was frustrated with a certain situation, Lovato said to And I was like, 'You know what, I'm just going to write about it.' After sharing the song with Nick, he called it amazing, but apparently did not reciprocate it reciprocating They had their reasons, he added. 'Only Forever' The Tell Me You Love Me track that follows Ruin the Friendship is titled Only Forever. It wasn't a single either, and like the previous song, it features little clues about Nick, like the lyrics, I've been thinking about the future/ and I've been thinking' about it now, referring to the name of his tour. This is a song about loving the person you want to explore a new relationship with to take that first step or take that next step. It's almost a sequel to 'Ruin the Friendship', he said in a Q&A, Billboard reported. Still, Lovato has never officially admitted that the songs are about Nick. 'I Love Me' RELATED: Demi Lovato referred to her famous ex in 'I Love Me' Music Video Finally, I Love Me is Lovato's last single, released in March 2020. The song peaked at number 18 on the Billboard Hot 100, remaining on the chart for ten weeks. Although the song is not directly about the Jonas Brothers, the music video presents a reference to them. In the video, Lovato walks through the memories of his past, including three brown-haired men in shiny suits, similar to those often wore by the Jonas. She looks at them and smiles. On his Instagram, Lovato wrote about the video: It was important for me to add special Easter eggs that represent certain times and chapters in my life. Before these unknowns were married men, the Jonas Brothers were dating some of the stars of Disney Channel and the music industry. A big mistake.
